 HEALTHY MALE ELEPHANTS. REPORTED ON MEETINGS WITH THE CITY REGARDING
 THE PARKING STRUCTURE.
- 7. Receive Fresno Chaffee Zoo Corporation's June 2024 Year-to-Date Financial Report RECEIVED. CFO NOR CROW REOPRTED ON JUNE ATTENDANCE, MUSEUMS FOR ALL PROGRAM, AND KINGDOMS OF ASIA PHASE II COMPLETION. REPORTED ON SELF-GENERATED REVENUES, TOTAL EXPENSES, AND OPERATING DEFICIT. REPORTED ON THE SAME FOR JULY AND NOTED DAYS SEVERAL EXHIBITS WERE CLOSED DUE TO TEMPERATURES OVER 110 DEGREES.
- 8. Receive Fresno Chaffee Zoo Corporation's 2023 Annual Audit from Price Paige & Company RECEIVED. TANNA TUCKER, AUDIT SUPERVISORS WITH PRICE PAIGE & COMPANY, PRESENTED THE RESULTS OF THEIR AUDIT. REPORTED THAT THE ZOO RECEIVED EXTENDED FEDERAL FUNDING IN 2023, WHICH RESULTED IN A REQUIRED SINGLE AUDIT AS WELL. THEY ISSUED A CLEAN, UNMODIFIED OPINION. DISCUSSION ENSUED REGARDING AUDIT TERMINOLOGY. MEMBER ARIAS NOTED THAT MEASURE Z WAS RENUED FOR 10 YEARS AND ASKED IF THERE IS A CLOSEOUT AUDIT THAT NEEDS TO BE CONDUCTED ON FUNDS FOR THE PREVIOUS 10 YEARS, OR DOES IT SIMPLY CONTINUE FOR EACH RENEWAL UNTIL IT EVENTUALLY ENDS? COUNSEL WILL RESEARCH THE QUESTION. HE ALSO NOTED THAT THE ZOO'S WEBSITE HAS THE 2019 ANNUAL REPORT AND NEEDS TO BE UPDATED TO THE CURRENT REPORT. THE AUTHORITY COORDINATOR NOTED HE WOULD WORK WITH THE ZOO TO GET THE CURRENT REPORT UPLOADED. DISCUSSION ENSUED REGARDING THE LOSS OF THE DISPOSAL OF ASSETS FIGURE INCLUDED WITHIN THE AUDIT.
- 9. Approve and authorize release of retention withheld on construction and design services related to Kingdoms of Asia Phase II (formerly Mixed Species Exhibit) for the following vendors:

 - GRAND TOTAL: \$660,257.91

MEMBER ARIAS MOVED TO APPROVE THE RELEASE OF RETENTION FOR BMY CONSTRUCTION GROUP, INC. AS WELL AS FOR CLR DESIGN TOTALLING \$660,257.91. SECONDED BY MEMBER TOSTE. THE MOTION PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.



RECOMMENDED ACTION:

Discuss 2025 Supplemental Measure Z Operating Request Update

DISCUSSION:

As requested by the Fresno County Zoo Authority Board of Directors, the prospective project list has been allocated between projects that fall within the guidelines of the Measure Z Capital Projects Policy and those that are more appropriately reflective of expenditures that should be paid from the Operations Fund.

While there are several expenditures that exceed \$30,000 reflected in the Operating Fund column, ZooCorp does not believe that these expenditures constitute "a major renovation, expansion, or replacement of a current Fresno Chaffee Zoo fixed asset (building, facility, structure, or exhibit)" or construction thereof, as they are more accurately classified as new or replacement equipment.

ZooCorp respectfully requests that the Fresno County Zoo Authority Board of Directors consider whether it would be amenable to transferring \$187,800 of surplus cash from the Operations Fund to the Capital Fund for the select projects that are in compliance with the Measure Z Capital Projects Policy. This action would preserve the current funds held within the Measure Z Capital Funds for upcoming large-scale construction projects including a new maintenance facility, new entryway, and new California-centric exhibit.

The prospective project listing remains in draft format and subject to change. Formal approval of funding for these projects is anticipated to be brought forth at a future date.

ORIGINAL DISCUSSION FROM AUGUST 28, 2024, MEETING:

At December 31, 2023, the Measure Z Operations Fund held cash of approximately \$6.3m, which has accumulated since inception of Measure Z in 2004. Based on the rate of cash receipts YTD

May 2024, it projected that this fund will be reduced to approximately \$6.0m at December 31, 2024.

Historically these funds have been used to supplement cash disbursements when annual approved budget allocations exceeded actual cash receipts. Additionally, surplus funds were intentionally utilized during onset of the COVID-19 pandemic in 2020 to supplement the ZooCorp's operations due to unprecedented facility closures.

For the 2025 fiscal year, ZooCorp would like to explore the possibility of utilizing some of these surplus funds for exhibit renovations and facility repairs. With limited construction activity anticipated on the Zoo's main campus during 2025, we have the unique opportunity to address a significant number of smaller projects that are often overlooked due to resource allocation in times of high construction activity. Additionally, moving forward with these projects will allow ZooCorp to continue to provide the highest level of quality care and wellbeing to the animals entrusted to this institution as well as address maintenance items in advance of our next AZA accreditation inspection, which is expected to begin in late 2026.

ZooCorp would seek approximately \$1,500,000 - \$2,000,000 of the available operating funds to complete these projects during the 2025 fiscal year. The following pages provide a non-exhaustive listing of example prospective projects and preliminary cost estimations, for discussion purposes.

SUBJECT: African River Project Agreement for Repayment of Funds

RECOMMENDED ACTION:

Approve and authorize the Chairman to execute the African River Project Agreement for repayment of \$838,722.70 expended on the postponed exhibit, effective upon execution, with quarterly payments of \$46,478.08 beginning January 2025 through October 2029, total not to exceed \$929,561.66.

DISCUSSION:

Several years ago, the Fresno Chaffee Zoo Corporation (ZooCorp) proposed the construction of an African River exhibit, which was approved by the Fresno County Zoo Authority (Authority) to use Measure Z funds for the design and construction of the Exhibit. \$838,722.70 was released by the Authority and expended by ZooCorp.

Following various challenges and obstacles, ZooCorp postponed the construction of the Exhibit in favor of focusing on other planned exhibits. Given that Measure Z funds were expended, the Authority requested that ZooCorp repay the funds to the Measure Z capital projects account for use on other exhibits as requested by ZooCorp.

The recommended agreement came before your Board at its regular meeting on June 26, 2024, but was tabled by the Board. Your Board requested certain changes and additions to the agreement, which are included in the recommended agreement.

The recommended agreement now includes a Promissory Note, which is attached to the recommended agreement as Exhibit B. It also includes a default provision, which provides that if the ZooCorp fails to make a required payment within 30 days of a payment due date, that constitutes a default. In that event, the Zoo Authority shall provide notice to ZooCorp, and provide a reasonable period not to exceed 30 days to cure the breach. If ZooCorp fails to cure that breach, all amounts due and owing under the agreement shall become immediately due and payable in full, and the Zoo Authority may exercise all of its rights under the agreement, under all Zoo Authority founding documents, policies, procedures, and bylaws, and as may otherwise be available in law or equity.

As detailed within the Agreement, ZooCorp shall repay the Authority the principal sum of \$838,722.70 with 20 quarterly payments of \$46,478.08, which includes an interest rate of four percent, beginning on January 2, 2025 through October 2, 2029. The total repayment with interest is \$929,561.66.

African River Project Agreement

AFRICAN RIVER PROJECT AGREEMENT

This AFRICAN RIVER PROJECT AGREEMENT ("Agreement") is dated by and between the Fresno County Zoo Authority ("Authority") and Fresno's Chaffee Zoo Corporation ("ZooCorp").

Recitals

WHEREAS, several years ago, ZooCorp proposed the construction of an African River exhibit ("Exhibit");

WHEREAS, the Authority approved the use of Measure Z funds for the design and construction of the Exhibit;

WHEREAS, the Authority released \$838,722.70 of Measure Z Funds ("Funds") for the design of the Exhibit;

WHEREAS, the ZooCorp expended the Funds for the design of the Exhibit;

WHEREAS, due to various factors, challenges, and obstacles, ZooCorp postponed the construction of the Exhibit in favor of other exhibits;

WHEREAS, the Authority has asked ZooCorp to repay the Funds to the Measure Z capital projects account for use on other exhibits, as requested by ZooCorp; and

WHEREAS, the Funds shall be repaid pursuant to the terms of this Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties agree as follows:

Terms

- 1. <u>Term.</u> This Agreement is effective immediately on execution by both parties.
- 2. <u>Promissory Note</u>. Concurrent with execution of this Agreement, ZooCorp agrees to execute the Promissory Note attached to this Agreement as Exhibit B.
- 3. Repayment of Funds. ZooCorp shall repay the Authority the principal sum of Eight Hundred Thirty-Eight Thousand Seven Hundred Twenty-Two Dollars and Seventy Cents (\$838,722.70), with an interest rate of four percent (4%). Payment shall be made to the Authority for deposit into the Measure Z Capital Projects account. The payments shall be made to the Fresno County Zoo Authority, Auditor-Controller/Treasurer-Tax Collector. Once the payment is received, these funds shall be deposited into the capital projects fund for the Authority, and shall be available for projects in accordance with the Fresno County Zoo Authority Transactions and Use Tax Ordinance (known as "Measure Z"), all applicable Authority policies and procedures, and subject to all required approvals of the Authority.
 - 4. <u>Schedule for Repayment</u>. ZooCorp shall begin the repayment of Funds

on January 2, 2025, continuing through October 2, 2029. The Funds shall be repaid in 20 quarterly payments, scheduled for the second (2nd) day of January, April, July and October of each year, with an extension for payment to the next business day if the 2nd is a holiday, Saturday, or Sunday, until the Funds have been repaid in full. Each quarterly payment will be \$46,478.08, as set forth in the Amortization Schedule set forth in Exhibit A to this Agreement.

- 5. <u>Prepayment</u>. ZooCorp shall have the right to prepay the principal and interest due at any time, without penalty.
- 6. <u>Late Payment</u>. A payment due hereunder shall be deemed late if it is not received by the Authority on or before 10 days after the due date of the payment, and each late payment shall incur a late charge equal to two percent (2%) of the payment.

7. Default and Material Breach.

- a. The failure of ZooCorp to repay in the Funds in full within 30 days of the payment due date, plus accrued interest, in accordance with the payment schedule in Exhibit A, until such amounts are fully repaid by ZooCorp, shall constitute a default under this Agreement by ZooCorp.
- b. In the event of a default by ZooCorp, as provided in the preceding section 7.a., Authority may, at Authority's election, immediately declare that ZooCorp is in material breach of this Agreement, and provide to ZooCorp written notice (Notice) of ZooCorp's material breach of this Agreement. Such written notice shall provide for a reasonable period not to exceed 30 days in which ZooCorp may cure the breach; if ZooCorp fails to cure the breach within a reasonable period not to exceed 30 days as stated in the Notice, all amounts due and owing to the Authority pursuant to the terms of this Agreement shall become immediately due and payable in full, plus accrued interest, until all such amounts are fully repaid by ZooCorp, and Authority may exercise its rights and remedies under this Agreement, under all Authority founding documents, policies, procedures, and bylaws, and as may otherwise be available in law or equity.
- 8. <u>Governing Law/Venue</u>. Venue for any action arising out of or relating to this Agreement shall only be in Fresno County, California. The rights and obligations of the Parties hereto and all interpretation and performance of this Agreement shall be governed in all respects by the laws of the State of California.

- 10. <u>Modification of Agreement</u>. This Agreement may not be altered, amended or modified, except in a writing executed by the authorized representative of both parties.
- 11. <u>Non-Assignment</u>. ZooCorp shall not assign, sublet, subcontract, or transfer any of ZooCorp's rights, duties, or obligations under this Agreement, without the prior express, written consent of Authority.
- 12. <u>No Third-Party Beneficiaries</u>. Nothing in this Agreement expressed or implied is intended or shall be construed to confer upon, or to give or grant to, any person or entity, other than the Authority and ZooCorp, any right, remedy, or claim under or by reason of this Agreement or any term, covenant, or condition hereof, and all terms, covenants, promises and agreements in this Agreement shall be for the sole and exclusive benefit of the Authority and the ZooCorp.
- 13. <u>Indemnification</u>. The ZooCorp agrees to indemnify, save, hold harmless, and at Authority's request, defend Authority and its officers, agents, and employees, from any and all costs and expenses, damages, liabilities, claims, and losses occurring to Authority as a direct result of willful misconduct by ZooCorp, its officers, agents, or employees in performance of this Agreement, and from any and all costs and expenses, damages, liabilities, claims, and losses occurring or resulting to any person, firm, or corporation who may be injured or damaged as a direct result of the willful misconduct of ZooCorp, its officers, agents, or employees in performance of this Agreement.
- 14. <u>Waiver</u>. The waiver, if any, by the Authority, of any breach or violation of any provision of this Agreement by the ZooCorp shall not be deemed to be a waiver by the Authority of any breach or violation by the ZooCorp of any other provision, nor of any subsequent breach or violation by SJVIA of the same or any other provision. Authority's acceptance of any partial payment by ZooCorp of any repayment obligation arising hereunder, including, but not limited to a payment of only the principal amount due and payable, shall not be deemed to be a waiver by Authority of the right to full repayment by ZooCorp of the remaining amount due and payable by ZooCorp to Authority pursuant to the terms hereof, including but not limited to accrued interest on the unpaid balance still remaining.
- 15. <u>Entire Agreement</u>. This Agreement states the entire agreement between the parties and supersedes any prior agreement, negotiation or understanding, . Each party acknowledges and agrees that no party, nor its agents, have made any promise, representation or warranty, express or implied, not set forth in this Agreement. This Agreement constitutes the entire Agreement between the parties and there are no terms, conditions, or representations except as set forth in this Agreement.

FOR VALUE RECEIVED, Fresno's Chaffee Zoo Corporation, a California corporation ("Borrower") promises to repay the Fresno County Zoo Authority ("Lender") the principal amount of eight hundred thirty-eight thousand, seven hundred twenty-two dollars and seventy cents (\$838,722.70) ("Funds"), plus interest described in this Promissory Note ("Note"), disbursed by the Lender to the Borrower for the design of the African River Exhibit, which Borrower has agreed to repay pursuant to that certain African River Project ("Project") Agreement ("Agreement").

- 1. <u>Borrower's Obligation</u>. This Promissory Note evidences Borrower's obligation to repay the Lender for deposit into the Measure Z Capital Projects Account the principal amount of eight hundred thirty-eight thousand, seven hundred twenty-two dollars and seventy cents (\$838,722.70) for the Funds disbursed to Borrower by Lender to finance the design of the Project.
- 2. <u>Interest Rate</u>. The interest rate for the repayment of the Funds by Borrower to Lender shall be four percent (4%).
- 3. Term and Schedule for Repayment. This Note shall have a term of four years and ten months, with payments to begin on January 2, 2025 ("Term"). Payments shall be made in 20 quarterly payments, scheduled for the second (2nd) day of January, April, July, and October of each year, with an extension for payment to the next business day if the 2nd is a holiday, Saturday, or Sunday, until the Funds have been repaid in full. Payments shall be made in accordance with repayment schedule, attached to this Note as Exhibit A. A payment due hereunder shall be deemed late if it is not received by the Lender on or before 10 days after the due date of the payment, and each late payment shall incur a late charge equal to two percent (2%) of the payment.
- 4. <u>No Assumption</u>. This Note shall not be assumable by the successors and assigns of Borrower without the prior written consent of Lender.

5. Terms of Payment.

(a) All payments due under this Note shall be paid in currency of the United States of America to Lender at any place that Lender may, from time to time, designate, which at the time of payment is lawful for the payment of public and private debts.

- (b) All payments on this Note shall be paid to the Lender at the following address: 2281 Tulare Street, Room 304, Fresno, CA 93721, or to such other place as the Lender may, from time to time, designate in writing.
- (c) The indebtedness evidenced by this Note may, at the option of the Borrower, be prepaid in whole or in part without premium or penalty. Lender will apply all the prepayments first to the payment of any costs, fees, or other charges due under this Note, and then to the principal balance.
- (d) This Note will be nonrecourse to the Borrower. The obligations of Borrower under this Note are absolute, and Borrower waives any and all rights to offset, deduct, or withhold any payments or charges due for any reason whatsoever.

6. Default.

- a) Any of the below events shall constitute a Default by Borrower under this Note:
 - i. Borrower fails to make payment in full within thirty (30) days of the due date, based on Section 3, Term and Schedule for Repayment Section, set forth hereinabove.
 - ii. Borrower becomes insolvent, or a receiver is appointed for any part of Borrower's property, Borrower makes an assignment for the benefit of creditors, or any proceeding is commenced either by Borrower or against Borrower under any bankruptcy or insolvency laws.
- b) In the event of a default by Borrower, as provided in the preceding section 6.a., Lender may, at Lender's election, immediately declare that Borrower is in material breach of this Agreement, and provide to Borrower written notice (Notice) of Borrower's material breach of this Agreement. Such written notice shall provide for a reasonable period not to exceed 30 days in which Borrower may cure the breach; if Borrower fails to cure the breach within a reasonable period not to exceed 30 days as stated in the Notice, all amounts due and owing to the Lender pursuant to the terms of the Agreement shall become immediately due and payable in full, plus accrued interest, until all such amounts are fully repaid by Borrower, and Lender may exercise all rights and remedies under the Agreement, under all Lender founding documents, policies, procedures, and bylaws, and as may otherwise be available in law or equity
- c) The amounts owing include, subject to any limits under applicable law, Lender's collection expenses, including attorneys' fees, appeals, and any reasonably anticipated post-judgment collection services. Borrower shall also pay any court costs in addition to all other sums allowed by law. The acceptance by Lender of any payment that is less than the total of all amounts due and payable at the time of such payment shall not constitute a waiver of the right to exercise any remedies or options, or nullify any prior exercise of any such remedy or option, without the express consent of Lender, except as and to the extent otherwise provided by law.
- d) The failure to exercise the remedy set forth in in the paragraph above, or any other remedy provided by law, upon the occurrence of one or more of the foregoing Events of Default shall not constitute a waiver of the right to exercise any remedy at any subsequent time in respect to the same or any other Event of

Default.

7. <u>Notices</u>. - 8. <u>Waivers</u>. The Borrower hereby waives diligence, presentment, protest and demand, and notice of protest, notice of demand, and notice of dishonor of this Note. Borrower expressly agrees that, without in any way affecting the liability of Borrower hereunder, Lender may extend any maturity date or the time for payment, or release any party liable hereunder. Failure of Lender to assert any right under this Note shall not be deemed a waiver of such right.
- 9. <u>Modification</u>. This Note may not be changed orally, but only by an agreement in writing signed by the party against whom enforcement of any waiver, change, modification, or discharge is sought.
- 10. <u>Severability</u>. If any one or more of the provisions in this Note is held to be invalid, illegal, or unenforceable in any respect by a court of competent jurisdiction, the validity, legality and enforceability of the remaining provisions will not in any way be affected or impaired. This Note shall be binding on and inure to the benefit of Borrower, Lender, and their respective successors and assigns.
- 11. <u>Governance</u>. This Note shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of California.
