

Approve an increase to the Zoo Authority's Professional & Specialized Services appropriations by \$27,389.65.

### **ALTERNATIVE ACTION:**

None.

### FISCAL IMPACT:

The request will increase the Zoo Authority's Professional & Specialized Services appropriations from \$212,242 to \$239,632.

### **DISCUSSION:**

The 2014-15 Zoo Authority (Authority) budget includes appropriations for Measure Z renewal costs. This cost was budgeted into Professional & Specialized Services for \$45,000-the best estimate at the time, but significantly less than the actual charge. (Attachment A) On March 12, 2015 the County Clerk invoiced the Authority for \$72,389.65. (Attachment B) The Authority is responsible for providing the County Clerk with payment as per Ordinance 2014-01. As such, to correspond with the invoiced charges, an increase of \$27,389.65 to Professional & Specialized Services appropriations is necessary.

However, per the July 17, 2014 agreement between the Authority and the Fresno Chaffee Zoo Corporation, payment in full to the Authority for all costs incurred by the County Clerk for Measure Z renewal was received by the Authority on April 13, 2015. Accordingly, there is no change in Net Position to the Authority.





### **RECOMMENDED ACTION:**

- Approve payment of \$72,389.65 from the Fresno County Zoo Authority 2014-15
  Professional & Specialized Services Budget to the Fresno County Clerk/Registrar
  of Voters for the direct (add-on) cost to place Measure Z on the November 4,
  2014 Statewide General Election ballot.
- 2. Adopt Resolution 2015-01 accepting donation of \$72,389.65 from Fresno Chaffee Zoo Corporation for the cost to place Measure Z on the November 4, 2014 State-wide General Election ballot.

### **FISCAL IMPACT:**

There will be no change to Net Position for the Fresno County Zoo Authority (Authority) as a result of the Recommended Action. Payment to the Clerk/Registrar of Voters (Clerk) will be offset by the \$72,389.65 received from the Fresno Chaffee Zoo Corporation (Corporation).

### **DISCUSSION:**

Both the July 27, 2004 Ordinance #04-014 that established the Measure Z sales tax, and the April 27, 2014 Ordinance #2014-01 imposing an extension of the tax, allow for the use of Measure Z funds to pay for the Clerk's costs associated with placing Measure Z on the ballot. Specifically, Section 4.030(a.) of the 2014 Ordinance states:

"The proceeds of the special tax shall first be applied to reimburse Fresno County for the costs of the election held pursuant to Revenue and Taxation Code Section 7286.43. The

proceeds of the tax shall also be available to pay the costs of any election for an extension of the tax."

Nevertheless, in early discussions on the renewal effort at Authority Board meetings, Corporation staff had assumed that the Corporation would be paying for these costs. Also, to mitigate concerns expressed by the Board of Supervisors, who cited Administrative Policy #71 (Attachment A) prohibiting the use of tax funds for the *promotion* of a sales tax measure, the Authority and the Corporation entered into an Agreement on July 14, 2014. The Agreement, Section 1 states:

"The CORPORATION agrees to reimburse the AUTHORITY for the actual cost paid by the AUTHORITY to the County to conduct the November 2014 Election with respect to Ordinance No. 2004-014 in an amount not to exceed seventy-five thousand dollars (\$75,000). The CORPORATION will make this donation with funds that are not derived from tax revenue granted to the CORPORATION by the AUTHORITY."

On March 12, 2015, the Authority received an invoice from the Clerk, (See Agenda Item 6, Attachment B) and as per the agreement, forwarded it to Zoo Director Scott Barton with a request for the agreed donation. Adoption of Resolution 2015-01 will allow the Authority to accept ZooCorp's donation and use such funds to pay the County Clerk for the ballot cost of Measure Z.

## ADMINISTRATIVE POLICY

### **NUMBER 71**

Prohibiting the Use of Public Funds for Political Advocacy

Effective Date: July 1, 2013

### **POLICY STATEMENT**

Government assets, including money, grant funds, paid staff time, equipment and supplies, facilities or any other government asset shall not be used for political campaigns of any type. Political campaigns are defined as political advocacy for or opposition to a matter or person that has qualified for the ballot.

### MANAGEMENT RESPONSIBILITY

Department Heads shall be held responsible for ensuring that government assets within their control are not used to advocate for or against any matter or person that has qualified for the hallot

This section does not prohibit the expenditure of government assets to create and provide informational or educational materials regarding a matter that has qualified for the ballot. Such information or educational materials shall provide a fair, accurate and impartial presentation of relevant information relating to the matter that has qualified for the ballot. However, government assets shall not be expended to create and provide such informational or educational materials in the 90 days prior to the election unless specifically authorized by the Board of Supervisors or required by the Public Records Act or other law.

Amendments to Zoo Authority Bylaws

### **RECOMMENDED ACTION:**

Conduct first reading of amendments to Bylaws, and waive reading in its entirety

### **DISCUSSION:**

The Fresno County Zoo Authority (Authority) Bylaws were adopted by the Board of Supervisors sitting as the Authority on January 25, 2005. The Bylaws were last amended in 2008 to allow for appointment of an alternate by the Mayor, so the City of Fresno could have representation on the Authority Board when the Mayor was not available. (See the current Bylaws attached hereto as Attachment A.)

The extension of Measure Z provides an opportunity to review the existing Bylaws, and to bring them up to date and in accordance with the Extension Ordinance, current Authority Board agreements, and procedures, practices and events that post-date the adoption of these existing Bylaws.

Accordingly, a proposed amended set of Bylaws (Attachment B hereto) are submitted for your Board's review and approval. These proposed amendments reflect the following changes to the current Bylaws:

- 1. On page 1, the Introduction adds a reference to the 2014 Extension Ordinance.
- 2. As noted under I.A., Members, the appointed Board first met on April 28, 2005.
- 3. On page 2, Under I.B., Organization, Paragraph 1, the language has been changed to a non-specific meeting location, anticipating that the Fresno County Employees' Retirement Association Building may be demolished at a future date to allow for the planned High Speed Rail station on the site.
- 4. In 1.B. Paragraph 7, the reference to a specific edition of Robert's Rules of Order has been removed. While the 11th Edition is now current, the proposed change is the preferred citation of the book's authors.

- 5. At page 4, Section III.B, General Expenditure Plan, Paragraph 1, the previous term "successor" in the last sentence has been changed to "extension" to match the language of the new Extension Ordinance.
- 6. The last sentence of Section III.B., Paragraph 2 has been updated to match the Extension Ordinance legal citation, reflecting current law.
- 7. At page 5, Section III.C, Specific Expenditure Plan, the original Paragraph 1 and the table under it have been deleted, as the City of Fresno has met its obligation to provide all the funds to the Corporation as specified.
- 8. Portions of Paragraphs 2 and 3 of Section III.C, as set forth in the 2008 Bylaws have been merged into a new Paragraph 1 that mirrors the wording of the Extension Ordinance, and the Authority's 2009 Capital Projects Policy (which changed the term "Capital Facilities" to refer to "Capital Projects"). (See Attachment C).
- 9. A new paragraph 3 has been added to Section III.C. to include the following language:

"The AUTHORITY shall have no obligation to distribute funds to the CORPORATION unless the AUTHORITY is satisfied that the CORPORATION has appropriately spent funds already distributed."

This above language derives from the 2014 Measure Z Extension Ordinance, and your Board saw fit to add it to the December 21, 2005 Agreement Regarding Procedures for the Distribution of Tax Revenue by means of an amendment executed by the Authority and the Zoo Corporation (Amendment 1 to Agreement Regarding Procedures for the Distribution of Tax Revenue, dated October 18, 2014.)

As noted under IV.A. and B. on page 8, if amendments to the Bylaws are to be approved, a super majority of five Board members must vote in favor at two regular meetings. The Bylaws then must be submitted to the Board of Supervisors, and will take effect upon that body's approval.

### FRESNO COUNTY ZOO AUTHORITY

### **BYLAWS**

### **INTRODUCTION**

The Resolution creating the Authority was adopted by the Fresno County Board of Supervisors on July 13, 2004. The Board of Supervisors, sitting as the Authority Board, then adopted Ordinance No 2004-1 on July 27, 2004. This ordinance, providing for a transactions and use tax of 0.1% for a period of ten years commencing on April 1, 2005, and including an expenditure plan for the use of the tax revenue, was approved by the electorate on November 2, 2004.

These Bylaws, adopted April 30, 2008, repeat and supplement the provisions of a subsequent Fresno County Board of Supervisors Resolution changing membership requirements (No. 08-024, January 15, 2008), and Zoo Authority Ordinance No 2004-1.

### I. AUTHORITY BOARD

### A. Members

The initial Authority Board is the Board of Supervisors. No later than March 31, 2005, this initial Authority Board shall be replaced with a seven-member Board, as follows:

- 1. Five qualified electors shall be appointed by the Board of Supervisors. Each member of the Board of Supervisors shall nominate one person. Each Authority Board member appointed under this provision shall serve for a term coterminous with the term of the nominating member of the Board of Supervisors. These members may not hold any other public office which pays a salary or per diem, but may hold another public office which is not incompatible with serving on the Authority Board and which provides only reimbursement of expenses.
- One qualified elector, who shall be selected for his or her expertise in zoo matters, shall be appointed by the Board of Supervisors. This member shall be nominated by the Chair of the Board of Supervisors, and shall serve for a term coterminous with the term of the nominating supervisor as Chair.
- 3. The seventh member of the Board shall be the Mayor of the City of Fresno.

4. Vacancies in the appointed positions shall be filled by the Board of Supervisors as provided above. Appointed members may resign by submitting a resignation in writing to the Board of Supervisors.

### B. Organization

The Board shall adopt policies to govern the activities of the Board. Such policies shall include, but not be limited to, the following:

- 1. The Board shall hold its regular meetings at the Fresno County Employees' Retirement Association building, at 1111 H St. in Fresno, at 9:00 a.m. on the fourth Wednesday of the month.
- A chair and vice-chair shall be elected at the first meeting of each calendar year. If neither is present or able to act, the members present shall elect a chair pro tem, who shall serve only until the chair or vice-chair is present and able to act. The Administrator shall serve as the Secretary.
- 3. The Board shall meet at least four times a year, and shall set its meeting schedule as far in advance as possible.
- 4. The Brown Act (Gov. Code, § 54950 et seq.) shall govern meetings of the Board.
- 4. Four Board members shall constitute a quorum, provided that no action shall be taken without the affirmative vote of at least three Board members.
- 6. The Board shall keep minutes of its proceedings and records of its activities and actions.
- 7. Robert's Rules of Order shall govern the proceedings of the Board in its transaction of business unless otherwise provided herein or by general law. Unless otherwise specified by the Board, Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised, 10th Edition, shall be used by the Board.
- 8. No proxy or substitute may vote in place of an appointed Board member.
- 9. The Mayor of the City of Fresno may appoint a member of the Fresno City Council to serve as the Mayor's alternate. The Mayor shall designate the alternate in writing. The designation shall become effective upon receipt of the notification by the Administrator.

- 10. In accordance with Fresno County Ordinance Code chapter 2.68, any member of the Board who is absent from the number of consecutive meetings specified in the chapter, according to the schedule of meetings adopted as required above, shall be deemed to have resigned his or her membership. The Administrator shall give prompt written notice to any member who will be deemed to have resigned upon the occurrence of one additional unexcused absence. The notice shall contain a statement advising the member of the absences and the consequences thereof, together with a copy of the ordinance code chapter. This provision may not be removed from the bylaws.
- 11. The Chair may make or second motions and shall have a vote on all questions. The Chair shall not be required to relinquish the chair in order to participate in discussions.

### C. Compensation

Members of the Board shall not be paid a salary nor shall they be entitled to per diem for attending Board meetings.

### I. POWERS AND DUTIES

### A. Powers

The Board may:

- 1. Adopt ordinances, resolutions, policies and procedures to implement the Resolution and Ordinance;
- 2. Enter into contracts to accomplish the purposes of the Authority;
- 3. Perform duties prescribed hereunder; and
- 4. Take all steps necessary to implement the Resolution and Ordinance, including hiring or contracting with appropriate staff, if necessary.

### B. Duties

The Board shall oversee the general administration of the funds and of the implementation of the Resolution and Ordinance, including but not limited to:

- 1. Requiring the Fresno's Chaffee Zoo Corporation (hereafter "Corporation") to enter into appropriate contracts to expend the tax proceeds as provided in the Ordinance.
- 2. Employing the services of an auditor to oversee the State Board of Equalization's records if desired, and, if deemed necessary, employing the services of an auditor or other professionals to audit and/or report on the activities of the Corporation regarding the expenditure of Authority funds and the progress of approved projects.

### II. EXPENDITURES OF TAX REVENUES

### A. Statutory Requirements

As required by Revenue and Taxation Code section 7286.43, the proceeds of the transactions and use tax collected under the Ordinance shall be used exclusively for zoos, zoological facilities, and related zoological purposes within this County.

### B. General Expenditure Plan

- 1. The tax proceeds shall first be applied to reimburse Fresno County for the costs of the election held pursuant to Revenue and Taxation Code section 7286.43. The proceeds of the tax shall also be available to pay the costs of any election for a successor tax.
- 2. Up to 2% of the tax proceeds shall be allocated for administrative costs of the Authority. This administrative allocation shall be made based upon budgeted estimates of administrative costs prior to any distribution of tax revenues in any fiscal year to the entity operating the Chaffee Zoo. "Administrative costs" shall mean actual expenses incurred by the Authority. Apportionment of any overhead and/or accounting of actual costs shall be accomplished in accordance with the standards and procedures found in the United States Office of Management and Budget Circular, OMB A-87, as amended.
- 3. The remaining annual tax proceeds shall be distributed to the Corporation, as provided below.

### C. Specific Expenditure Plan

1. No tax revenue shall be provided to the Corporation until the City of Fresno and the Corporation both certify to the Authority that the

City has provided the percentage of public funding it provided to the Zoo in 2003-2004 (approximately \$1.2 million), pursuant to the following schedule:

- 2. The Corporation shall submit to the Authority its preliminary plans for capital facilities projects in the Zoo. The plans shall be submitted on an annual basis, or on such a schedule as agreed to by the Authority and the Corporation, in such numbers and in such format as required by the Authority. "Capital facilities" shall mean facilities or animals with a useful life of five years or more. The plans shall show that a minimum of two-thirds of the projected net tax revenue will be spent on capital improvement projects in the Zoo.
- 3. The Corporation shall also submit to the Authority, on the same schedule, its plans for spending the remaining net tax revenue. The plans shall show that no more than one-third of the projected tax revenue will be spent on operations and maintenance of the Zoo.

- 4. The Authority may approve or disapprove the Corporation's plans. If the Authority disapproves the plans, the Authority shall be under no obligation to provide tax revenues to the Corporation until the plans are revised to the satisfaction of the Authority.
- 5. The Authority may, with appropriate notice, request that the Corporation send one or more representatives to any Authority meeting, and may consider the cooperation of the Corporation in this regard in future funding decisions.
- 6. When the Authority is satisfied that the plans of the Corporation comply with the Resolution and Ordinance, the Authority shall approve the plans and shall enter into appropriate contracts with the Corporation to provide funding on an appropriate schedule. The Authority generally shall not enter into contracts to provide funding directly to providers of goods and/or services to the Corporation, but may do so if the Corporation requests this direct contracting.
- 7. The Authority may restrict the funding it provides to the Corporation to correspond with an approved time schedule, or for any other reason within the discretion of the Authority.
- 8. The Authority may authorize multi-year capital projects and/or programs within the time period established for the tax.
- 9. The Authority may pledge future annual tax proceeds as security for loans to fund capital projects at the Chaffee Zoo.

### D. Reports

- 1. The Corporation shall provide the Authority with annual use statements demonstrating the use of funds authorized by the Authority. This statement shall be made in a form acceptable to the Authority and shall be approved by a certified public accountant prior to its submission to the Authority. The Authority may also require the Corporation to provide independently audited statements or other reports on an annual or other basis at the entity's expense.
- 2. The Authority may request that status reports on the progress of projects and programs be submitted by the Corporation to the Authority for public discussion at any Authority meeting from time to time.

3. The Authority shall make an annual report to the Board of Supervisors regarding its proceedings and actions.

### E. Prohibited Expenditures

The Authority shall require the Corporation to agree that no tax revenue shall be expended for the following ineligible activities:

- 1. Activities normally funded by a city or county through federal, state, and/or local revenues such as animal control, health care, criminal justice programs, and social service programs.
- 2. Programs not open and available on an equal basis to all residents of Fresno County.
- 3. Programs which promote religious or sectarian purposes.
- 4. Scholarships, grants, or other payments to individuals for educational purposes.
- 5. Except as herein allowed, programs of federal, state, or local governments or their subsidiaries.
- 6. Out-of-state travel expense.
- 7. Programs or policies that discriminate against any individual or group on the basis of race, sex, color, ethnicity, religious preference, or national origin in the operation of facilities or in membership policies.

### III. AMENDMENT OF BYLAWS

### A. Approval by Authority Board

An amendment to these Bylaws may be proposed at any time. The amendment shall be presented to the Board at two regular meetings, with at least one week between meetings. At least five members of the Board must vote in favor of the amendment at each reading in order for it to be sent to second reading or approved. If the proposed amendment is altered at the first reading, the altered version shall be presented for first reading at the next regular meeting. Corrections of typographical or clerical errors are not alterations within the meaning of this section.

### B. Adoption by Board of Supervisors

If the Authority Board approves an amendment to the bylaws, the amendment shall be submitted to the Board of Supervisors. The amendment shall become effective immediately upon adoption by the Board of Supervisors.

### **BYLAWS**

### INTRODUCTION

The Resolution creating the Authority (hereinafter "Resolution") was adopted by the Fresno County Board of Supervisors on July 13, 2004. The Board of Supervisors, sitting as the Authority Board, then adopted Ordinance No 2004-1 on July 27, 2004 (hereinafter "Ordinance"). This Ordinance, providing for a transactions and use tax of 0.1% for a period of ten years commencing on April 1, 2005, and including an expenditure plan for the use of the tax revenue was approved by the electorate on November 2, 2004, and was extended for another 10 years on November 4, 2014.

These Bylaws, adopted \_\_\_\_\_\_, repeat and supplement the provisions of a subsequent Fresno County Board of Supervisors Resolution changing membership requirements (No. 08-024, January 15, 2008), Zoo Authority Ordinance No 2004-1, and Extension Ordinance 2014-01.

### I. AUTHORITY BOARD

### A. Members

The initial Authority Board <u>was</u> the Board of Supervisors. A sevenmember <u>appointed Authority</u> Board <u>replacing the Board of Supervisors</u> held its first meeting on April 28, 2005, is comprised as follows:

- 1. Five qualified electors, who shall be appointed by the Board of Supervisors. Each member of the Board of Supervisors shall nominate one person. Each Authority Board member appointed under this provision shall serve for a term coterminous with the term of the nominating member of the Board of Supervisors. These members may not hold any other public office which pays a salary or per diem, but may hold another public office which is not incompatible with serving on the Authority Board and which provides only reimbursement of expenses.
- 2. One qualified elector, who shall be selected for his or her expertise in zoo matters, shall be appointed by the Board of Supervisors. This member shall be nominated by the Chair of the Board of Supervisors, and shall serve for a term coterminous with the term of the nominating supervisor as Chair.

- 3. The seventh member of the Authority Board shall be the Mayor of the City of Fresno.
- 4. Vacancies in the appointed positions shall be filled by the Board of Supervisors as provided above. Appointed members may resign by submitting a resignation in writing to the Board of Supervisors.

### B. Organization

The <u>Authority Board (hereinafter "Board")</u> shall adopt policies to govern its activities. Such policies shall include, but not be limited to, the following:

- 1. The Board shall hold its regular meetings at the offices of the Fresno County Employees' Retirement Association, or any other appropriate designated site, at 9:00 a.m. on the fourth Wednesday of the month.
- 2. A chair and vice-chair shall be elected at the first meeting of each calendar year. If neither is present or able to act, the members present shall elect a chair pro tem, who shall serve only until the chair or vice-chair is present and able to act. The Administrator shall serve as the Secretary.
- 3. The Board shall meet at least four times a year, and shall set its meeting schedule as far in advance as possible.
- 4. The Brown Act (Gov. Code, § 54950 et seq.) shall govern meetings of the Board.
- 4. Four Board members shall constitute a quorum, provided that no action shall be taken without the affirmative vote of at least three Board members.
- 6. The Board shall keep minutes of its proceedings and records of its activities and actions.
- 7. Robert's Rules of Order shall govern the proceedings of the Board in its transaction of business unless otherwise provided herein or by general law. Unless otherwise specified by the Board, the current edition of Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised shall be used by the Board.
- 8. No proxy or substitute may vote in place of an appointed Board member.
- 9. The Mayor of the City of Fresno may appoint a member of the Fresno City Council to serve as the Mayor's alternate. The Mayor

shall designate the alternate in writing. The designation shall become effective upon receipt of the notification by the Administrator.

- 10. In accordance with Fresno County Ordinance Code chapter 2.68, any member of the Board who is absent from the number of consecutive meetings specified in the chapter, according to the schedule of meetings adopted as required above, shall be deemed to have resigned his or her membership. This administrative allocation shall be made based upon budgeted estimates of administrative costs prior to any distribution of tax revenues in any fiscal year to the <u>Corporation</u>. "Administrative costs" shall mean actual expenses incurred by the <u>Authority</u>. Apportionment of any overhead and/or accounting of actual costs shall be accomplished in accordance with the standards and procedures found in <u>Title 2 Code of Federal Regulations</u>, Subtitle A, Chapter II, Part 225.

3. The remaining annual tax proceeds shall be distributed to the Corporation, as provided below.

#### C. Specific Expenditure Plan

- 1. The Corporation shall submit to the Authority its preliminary plans for Capital projects, as well as its plans for operations and maintenance at the Fresno Chaffee Zoo (hereinafter "Zoo"). The plans shall be submitted on an annual basis, or on such a schedule as agreed to by the Authority and the Corporation, in such numbers and in such format as required by the Authority. "Capital Projects" shall meet the definition of the Measure Z Capital Projects Policy, adopted June 24, 2009. A minimum of two-thirds of the funds shall be for capital projects, and up to one-third of the funds shall be available for operations and maintenance.
- 2. The Authority may approve or disapprove the Corporation's plans. If the Authority disapproves the plans, the Authority shall be under no obligation to provide tax revenues to the Corporation until the plans are revised to the satisfaction of the Authority.
- 3. The Authority shall have no obligation to distribute funds to the CORPORATION unless the AUTHORITY is satisfied that the CORPORATION has appropriately spent funds already distributed. (Agreement between Authority and Corporation, dated December 21, 2005, as amended)
- 4. The Authority may, with appropriate notice, request that the Corporation send one or more representatives to any Authority Board meeting, and may consider the cooperation of the Corporation in this regard in future funding decisions.

#### Measure Z Capital Projects Policy

#### Adopted June 24, 2009

Purpose: The purpose of this policy is to define the criteria of capital projects that qualify for reimbursement of Measure Z Capital Project Funds. In addition to meeting the requirements of this policy, the project and related budget must have been previously approved by the Zoo Authority Board (as required by Ordinance 2004-1) either through the Master Plan or Annual Capital Projects Plan and an adopted capital projects budget.

### Measure Z-funded capital improvement projects must meet one of the conditions 1-3.

1. The construction or purchase of a Fresno Chaffee Zoo fixed asset (building, facility, structure, or exhibit), that has a useful operational life of 5 years or longer, and a cost of \$30,000 or more. Capital outlay expenditures required for the intended use of the construction or purchase of the asset may be included at the discretion of the Zoo Authority Board.

#### OR

2. A major renovation, expansion, or replacement of a current Fresno Chaffee Zoo fixed asset (building, facility, structure, or exhibit) that extends the useful operational life of the asset by 5 years or more, or expands the capacity of an existing asset, and has a cost of \$30,000 or more. Capital outlay expenditures required for the intended use of the renovation, expansion, or replacement of the asset may be included at the discretion of the Zoo Authority Board.

#### OR

3. Cost required for the acquisition and safe transport of animals that would have a useful life to the Fresno Chaffee Zoo of at least 5 years, including transportation, travel, and health expenses during such transportation and travel.

## More Valley properties targeted for possible condemnation for high-speed rail route

- The California Public Works Board authorized the use of eminent domain, or condemnation, on 28 pieces of property in Fresno, Kings and Madera counties for the state's high-speed rail project.
- Among the properties targeted are the Greyhound bus station in downtown Fresno and part of a northwest Fresno business park.
- The state is continuing to step up the pace at which it authorizes condemnation resolutions as the California High-Speed Rail Authority lags behind its property acquisition schedule for the rail route.

More than two dozen pieces of property in Fresno, Kings and Madera counties were added Friday to a list of land that could be cleared for California's high-speed rail route, signaling a quickening of pace for the project

The properties include the <u>Greyhound Bus Lines terminal at Tulare and H streets</u> in downtown Fresno and a portion of the Fresno Interstate Business Park complex on Golden State Boulevard north of Ashlan Avenue. They range in size from slivers — a few hundredths of an acre — to more than 12 acres.

All of them were marked Friday for eminent domain action by the State Public Works Board, which oversees the acquisition of property for state projects. The board, which met in Sacramento, approved 28 resolutions declaring a public need for the state to take the property for the controversial statewide rail project. The targeted properties add up to about 81 acres.

The board's 3-0 vote brings to 303 the number of properties for which it has authorized eminent domain or condemnation. They represent a total of about 273 acres. The properties run the gamut from businesses to homes to farms, and they all have one thing in common: They sit in the path of either the railroad right of way planned to form the backbone of the rail system in the Valley or related structures such as road over- or underpasses.

The <u>California High-Speed Rail Authority</u> wants to acquire the 1.4-acre Greyhound bus station property to allow for vehicle and pedestrian access to boarding platforms at the future high-speed train station site, bounded by Tulare, Fresno, H and G streets. According to Bee archives, the bus station at that site dates to 1960.

At the Interstate Business Park in northwest Fresno, the rail agency wants less than 1 acre of the 8-acre property. The long, narrow site houses a cluster of businesses in late 1980s-vintage buildings that run almost perpendicular to Golden State Boulevard. The property is needed to rebuild a new alignment for Golden State Boulevard between Richert and Santa Ana avenues.

In recent months, the rail agency has stepped up the rate at which it is asking the Public Works Board for eminent domain resolutions. Such resolutions mark the first step of a legal process of going to court to condemn the property for the train project. In many cases, the resolutions seem to be a way for the state to achieve negotiating leverage with owners who are reluctant to sell or are unhappy with the amount the state has offered to pay for their property.

But the rail agency is also working to speed the pace at which it is acquiring land for the first two construction sections in the Valley. The authority inked a billion-dollar contract in mid-2013 with a team of engineering and construction firms to design and build the first 29-mile segment between south Fresno and northeast Madera. More than a year and half later, major construction has yet to commence, largely because the rail authority had only made 108 parcels available — out of more than 520 needed — for the contracting team to do its work.

Earlier this year, the rail authority board awarded a second contract of more than \$1.2 billion for the next section of the route, about 65 miles from Fresno to about the Tulare-Kern county line. About 545 pieces of property are needed in that stretch, none of which the agency has in hand.

The state continues to face a time crunch when it comes to building the Valley segments of the route. A good chunk of the \$3 billion that the Obama administration pledged to the state for construction in the Valley comes with the condition that the money be exhausted by Sept. 30, 2017, just 21/2 years from now. That's going to be a tall order if the authority continues to be slow in nailing down the property it needs for contractors to work.



## Fresnans attend first planning meeting for high-speed rail station

The first planning meeting for Fresno's newest train station ran like clockwork. Now if construction of high-speed rail can somehow follow suit. About 60 people showed up Tuesday evening at fire department headquarters to pitch ideas, offer hopes and express worries for downtown's proposed bullettrain station. History was much on everyone's mind. Fresno got its start in the late-19th century as a railroad hub for farmers making the most of a rich land.

Six or so generations later, Fresnans must figure out how to make the most of a station serving an unbelievably speedy iron horse.

Assistant planning director Dan Zack told the audience to find ways to "catapult Fresno into its next 100 years." That kind of mission can turn strong legs into jelly. Fortunately for the volunteers, event organizers gave the event an easy-to-grasp structure.

High-speed rail is coming, officials said. Fresno's bullet-train station in the area of H and Mariposa streets will be a trailblazer. High-speed rail leaders want something that fits the needs of a unique transportation system. City Hall wants something that fits into Fresno's revitalized future. Both sides want something dramatic that captures the world's attention.

Tuesday's event, billed as a workshop, began with a name. Imagine, people were told, that the area within a half-mile radius of the proposed station is a district of unique character. This new district is to be called the Fresno Station District. A half-mile radius would take in Fulton Corridor, Chukchansi Park, the Convention Center, Warnors Theatre and Chinatown. All are within a 10-minute walk of the station.

Downtown Fresno already is embracing considerable change. Mayor Ashley Swearengin expects this year to begin replacing Fulton Mall with a two-way street open to vehicles. The long-awaited bus rapid transit system is on the horizon. The Cultural Arts District continues to fill with new housing.

The question at hand: How is this new train station to fit most effectively into everything — Fresno Station District, downtown, inner-city Fresno, the entire metropolitan area?

### Fresno Chaffee Zoo board signs on to save Storyland and Playland

- Zoo Corporation approves relationship with struggling Storyland and Playland parks.
- Structure of Storyland and Playland management could change.
- Parks need \$850,000 in repairs, but attractions may not open until 2016.

Fresno Chaffee Zoo Corporation board agreed Wednesday night to come to the rescue of Rotary Storyland and Playland.

Under the agreement, the zoo corporation will oversee a new board to run the parks, initiate a fundraising effort for Storyland and Playland, and use zoo employees on a donated or reimbursement basis to get the parks operating again by early next year. Storyland and Playland will also employ its own staff as required for operations, renovation or maintenance.

The dozen members of the existing Rotary Storyland and Playland board still must approve the agreement, which also will require all but one board member to resign. The one remaining member, who was not identified, will join the new board, which will be led by Scott Miller, owner of Gazebo Gardens.

Other new board members include: Bruce Batti, president of Jeffrey Scott Agency; retired Fresno County Supervisor Susan Anderson; zoo corporation chairman John Valentino; and Fresno Chaffee Zoo director Scott Barton. Nine to 11 members will eventually comprise the board, Miller said.

The zoo corporation's unanimous vote was met with applause. For the past eight years, there have been talks on-and-off about the zoo overseeing Storyland and Playland. Those seemingly ended with Wednesday night's decision.

"We all know we have gone through some tough times, but we just want to thank all of you for your support," Ron Sidoli, a Storyland and Playland board member, told the zoo corporation board.

Storyland needs significant repairs to comply with the Americans with Disabilities Act. It also has issues with lifted sidewalks and requires a new irrigation system. Playland will need railroad track repairs, maintenance for other rides, cement work and general cleanup.

The zoo can't use Measure Z funds for any projects outside the zoo's property, but Barton said the zoo is willing to consider "cross-marketing" ideas and help with the structural makeup of the boards for Storyland and Playland.

The parks' attendance has dropped significantly in recent years after peaking at 152,000 in 2011. Efforts to keep prices low for visitors while attendance and concession sales have fallen led to the recent financial problems, officials said.

Valentino, the zoo corporation board's president, vowed to move swiftly to fix the parks.

"This new board will immediately launch and manage a community campaign to raise \$850,000 by Jan. 31, 2016," Valentino said. "The fundraising campaign will be structured to engage all community sectors and to attract matching funds for qualifying donations."

Once \$200,000 is reached, renovation and maintenance can begin. The first projects will be in Storyland, the train that runs between the two parks and getting the carousel open and operating by Jan. 10, 2016. Playland will be evaluated separately with the most appropriate improvements by Sept. 15, 2016, Valentino said.

Bringing the zoo into the process allows "donors, many of whom we've already talked to, to feel a lot more comfortable contributing with the zoo as a presence in the operation," Valentino said. "So, we like the idea of community involvement and we think that has begun."

Miller said he was impressed by the group forming to serve as the new board. Resources are already aligning to help in the renovations, he added.

"People in the community see Storyland and Playland and the zoo as being connected and the heft that your (zoo corporation) board carries will be a tremendous benefit to use going forward for the fundraising we need to get this thing rolling," Miller said.

Earlier this week, Valentino said the zoo and the two struggling parks have a great deal in common.

"The zoo is getting greater and greater attendance, so there is a bigger opportunity for any location right there next to the zoo," he said.

## Together we can reopen Playland and Storyland

Both attractions are integral to Fresno's history and future.

ow that it appears the Fresno Chaffee Zoo Corporation will lend a hand to get Playland and Storyland up and running again, it will be up to our community to donate the \$850,000 needed for repairs, compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act and a new irrigation system.

That amount of money, while significant, is not insurmountable. And while large contributions from well-heeled donors will be important, donations as small as \$1, \$5 and \$10 can go a long way toward reopening the two children's attractions at Roeding Park.

Indeed, if every adult in Fresno who rode Playland's carousel as a child contributes \$5 to the restoration effort, the goal will be met.

Playland is an amusement park. Storyland is a series of exhibits promoting literacy. Both are integral to Fresno's history — and future.

With a little sprucing up, both can reopen and continue to entertain and educate children at bargain prices. Providing low-cost fun for families is not a civic responsibility, but it should be a civic priority.

You might not know that Playland opened in May 1955, six weeks before the gates at Disneyland swung open. Local Rotary Clubs — acting upon a proposal by Dr. Joe Logan, then-president of the North Fresno Rotary — teamed up to raise

money and build the park. That first day, 14,000 ride tickets were sold, at 10 cents each, and the construction debt was repaid within three years.

Seven years later, Storyland sprouted next door, backed by City Hall and community groups. The first year saw more than 250,000 visitors take in the Alice in Wonderland maze, Mr. MacGregor's Cabbage Path and other attractions.

Profits from the amusement park were planted back into the community by the Rotary Playland board of directors. It was Playland money that, in 1964, bought 50 acres of extra land to help form Woodward Park. More cash went toward the zoo's reptile house, a new home for Nosey the elephant, land for Logan Park, and the Shinzen Friendship Garden.

Expanded entertainment options and the advent of state inspection of amusement rides took a toll on Playland. In 2000, it was down to two rides, but a fundraising campaign and a state grant brought some of the magic back.

The reality is, Playland and Storyland need regular tender, loving care. They will require community support beyond this fundraising drive. And to boost attendance, industry experts say Playland should change one ride every year.

That's OK. Fresno is up to the challenge.

Families need affordable entertainment and places to bond. We look forward to the grand reopening of Playland and Storyland and good times there for many years to come.

### Storyland and Playland board members resign, fundraising to start

The Rotary Storyland and Playland board resigned Wednesday night except for one board member who will join a new management committee overseen by Fresno Chaffee Zoo Corporation officials.

Wayne Thomas, a Fresno lawyer, is the lone Storyland and Playland board member to join the new board that includes businessmen Scott Miller and Bruce Batti, as well as retired Fresno County Supervisor Susan Anderson and John Valentino, Fresno Chaffee Zoo Corp. board chairman. Storyland and Playland's board had about a dozen members.

An evaluation of the parks shows about \$850,000 in repairs are needed. The board for the two parks had trouble raising money and attendance was falling since peaking in 2011.

Under an agreement reached last week and approved by the Fresno Chaffee Zoo Corporation, zoo officials will oversee the new board and manage the parks, initiate a fundraising effort and use zoo employees on a donated or reimbursement basis to get the parks operating again by early next year. Storyland and Playland will also employ its own staff as required for operations, renovation or maintenance.

On Thursday, a fundraising effort will be announced by Valley Yellow Pages, which will send preaddressed envelopes inserted into bags of each of the 290,000 phone books delivered in the Fresno area.
